- To promote peace and harmony
- To enhance sustainable living
- To motivate pupils
- To raise standards
- To promote effective use of ICT

- Digital Literacy
- Critical thinking and problem solving
- Creativity and imagination
- Student Leadership
- Collaboration and communication
- Citizenship



# Steps to Develop the European Dimension

- European? International? Global?
- Appoint a European Co-ordinator with a job description (See examples and discuss)
- Assemble a team of like-minded teachers
- Identify the subjects that are likely to be key
- Conduct an audit of teaching and learning activities
- Draw up a policy (See examples and discuss)
- Now you are ready to make a whole-school approach to the European Dimension



#### More steps

- Build a good relationship with your National Agency
- Research funding opportunities
- Access classroom resources to increase the pupils' understanding of international learning
- Find a partner school(s) to collaborate with
- Employ a Language Assistant
- Accreditation for the school e.g. in the UK-International school Award (ISA)
